The biker that gave you this brochure knows the answer. He or she may have been down the same road you have been or even worse. If not, they can introduce you to someone that has been where you are right now and has found the answer elsewhere.

You are probably wondering why you were given this brochure. It's because the person that gave it to you cares about you and your future and wants to share what they have found.

What have they found? They found that God cares about them and where they are headed for in eternity after they die. God provides a way out of a life full of disappointments and provides a way to be one of His people. That way is though His Son, Jesus Christ.

I don't want to be a religious fanatic!

You don't have to be a religious fanatic to be a Christian. Most Christians lead a quiet normal life with the comfort of knowing that by accepting Jesus as their Savior, they don't have to worry about finding what makes them happy; they already know.

When someone becomes a Christian, they usually don't have a personality change. If they are a quiet person, they stay that way with the knowledge that that have been saved and share their experience with others in a quiet manner. Others, may be an excitable person and will be enthusiastic about sharing what has happened in their life and be more outward in expressing it.

What it boils down to is you and your will. If you accept Christ as your savior, you will not be forced to do anything like preaching or go around quoting the Bible to everyone. Whatever you do will be because you want to do it. God does not have robots; He calls us His children.

I'm not good enough.

The things you have done in the past that were bad is called sin. It doesn't matter if you told a lie or stole a million dollars, it is sin and there is no different level in God's reference to it. It's all the same to Him.

To be one of God's people, your sins have to be forgiven. To have your sins forgiven, all you have to do is ask God to forgive them. How do you ask? When you talk to God, it is called prayer.

The Final Steps

You need to know that there is punishment for sin, just like there is punishment for a crime. God says that the punishment for sin is death. Just pray to God to be saved. If you need help, ask the person that gave you this brochure to show you how. Here is an example of a prayer to ask for your salvation:

Heavenly Father, please forgive me for my sins and make me one of your children. Thank You for providing a way out of my sins. I pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.

Welcome! If you prayed that prayer and truly meant it, you are now one of God's children and are on the road to Heaven. The person that gave you this brochure can help you further or can introduce you to someone that can. Don't be afraid to ask any questions. If he or she doesn't have an answer, they will get someone that will. There is more information on the back of this brochure, which is commonly called a tract.
